Mississauga Telehandler Training Courses - The employer has the responsibility to make certain that their workers are trained to work proficiently with telehandler equipment. The employees have to be assessed for their ability to make use of the machinery. If deficiencies are found, employers have to provide training so that employees attain the needed level of ability. The level of responsibility of the person has to be taken into account when training is offered. Effective training will remedy any deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training can be undertaken through in-house session or by hiring an external training provider. An assessment at the completion of the training period would determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

Regulations and guidelines for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not deal with such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, the utilization of rotating machinery or using other attachments. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work place.

Inspection and maintenance

The telehandler needs routine maintenance like any other equipment. The machinery would wear out over time, so correct maintenance is needed to ensure the safe use of the telehandler equipment. Inspections and checks are vital to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators should have machine-specific training in order to prevent, rectify and monitor problems associated with damage, wear and deterioration. Employees require experience and competence in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer should be viewed seriously and complied with, taking into account such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machinery share the responsibility for making sure that the telehandler is in full working condition. Pre-use checks are usually carried out by the user, whereas general maintenance is usually performed by the telehandler owner.
